Attendance Policy


- 3 tardies in one class =1 absence in that Class.

ANTON ART CENTER ANNOUNCES 2025 MACOMB COUNTY ANNUAL SECONDARY STUDENT SHOW

The Anton Art Center proudly announces the annual county-wide Macomb County Annual Secondary Student Show, on display March 8 through April 12, 2025, presented by Extra Credit Union. This exhibition showcases 369 selected original artworks from 825 submissions. The event is a celebration of achievement in the arts for 207 students in grades 7 through 12 in partnership with 38 art instructors from a collection of 25 public, private, and charter schools in 15 districts.

Not only will the selected student artists have the unique opportunity to show their work in a professional art gallery, but they will also be eligible for 39 additional special awards with over \$1,200 in cash and gift certificates awards, as well as additional art supplies prizes from the Detroit Institute of Arts.

"The county-wide student art exhibit is a meaningful experience for students, teachers, families, and visitors, alike." adds Stephanie Hazzard, Exhibition Manager of the Anton Art Center, "In a show of this scale, the gallery space becomes an impressive presentation of emerging talent, emphasizing the importance and impact of arts education for youth of all ages: providing opportunities to develop mental health understanding and problem solving skills, as well as inspiring community involvement, goalsetting, and expanding worldview."

Student artwork will be on display to the public at the Anton Art Center March 8 through April 12, 2025. - Successfully complete and submit all of the required documents and forms.
