
2025-2026 School Calendar

Many families and staff members have been inquiring about the first day of the 2025-26 school year. By law, key dates included in school district calendars are subject to collective bargaining.

We recognize the importance of planning family schedules as they relate to the start of school. While productive and collaborative negotiations are continuing, we are making the following dates available at this time:

August 25, 2025	NO SCHOOL – Professional Development
August 26, 2025	First Day of School for Students (1/2 day Elementary; Full day Secondary)
August 29, 2025	NO SCHOOL
September 1, 2025	NO SCHOOL – Labor Day
September 17, 2025	NO SCHOOL – Professional Development

In addition, select vacation dates – such as Thanksgiving, Winter Break, and Spring Break - are aligned with the <u>Macomb County</u> <u>Common Calendar</u>. **Please note** – the final negotiated agreements may result in additional days connected to these breaks. *UCS One-to-One Device

UCS issued laptops and original Dell chargers will be collected from current 9th grade students and those 8th grade students attending the UAIS, Stevenson MADE, or the UCS Academy for Health and Human Services on Wednesday, June 11th. Laptops will also be collected on Friday, June 7 from Virtual students (between 11:00am and 1:00pm) and those students not returning to Malow in the fall. If the charger turned in is not an original Dell charger, a \$38 charge will be issued. If your student is enrolled in summer school, they will be assigned a laptop on the first day of summer school. 7th and 8th graders that will be returning to Malow in the fall and have any damage (i.e. missing keys) please have your student report them to Ms. Bertucci right away. If you purchased insurance, damages will be covered according to the technology agreement.

Technology device insurance for the 2025-2026 school year will be available for purchase via PaySchools Central between Monday, August 11, 2025 and Friday, September 5, 2025. The price will remain at \$20 per device.

Medication Pick Up

Any medications that are not picked up by noon on Friday, June 13, 2025, will be disposed of. Medications cannot be stored in the office over the summer. We will also need to collect your child's UCS issued laptop device and we want to be prepared to facilitate this at the end of the school year. Finally, if you have moved, but are still attending Malow, please let Mrs. Newbold know this as address information will need to be updated in PowerSchool.

Attendance & Grading

Attendance is required and tracked in accordance with <u>Board of Education policy 5115</u>. Parents should call the attendance line to report all absences (586-797-3599). Attendance will be taken each hour. Tardiness will be tracked the same way as face-to-face instruction. The Malow office will continue to communicate all absences via automated email to parents on the same day. Actual grades will be given and posted on PowerSchool. We recommend that all parents consistently check PowerSchool for updated grades and attendance.

Attendance Line / Late Arrival Call-in

If an absence is absolutely necessary, **parents must call the Malow attendance voice mail BEFORE 9:00 a.m. The attendance phone number is 797-3599.** Give the student's name (**PLEASE SPELL LAST NAME**), grade, reason for absence and length of absence. The voice mail is on twenty-four hours a day, so you can avoid busy phone lines in the morning by phoning in the night before. If unable to reach the voice mail, parents may call the Main Office at 797-3500. If it is impossible to call the school, the parent must supply a signed note stating the date and reason for absence when the student returns to school or the absence will be counted as unexcused.

Non-School Issued Electronic Communications Devices (UCS Student Handbook)

The personal use of non-school issued cell phones or other electronic communications devices (ECDs) by students is prohibited at any time while in school or in a district vehicle. Students may carry ECDs during the school day, but they cannot be displayed or used without permission from a teacher or administrator for educational purposes. Personal use of the device shall be limited to the time before and after the school day and only when students are outside the building. ECDs shall not be used during instructional time, lunch, passing time between classes or on any school bus without permission of a school official.

During tests and assessments, cell phones/ECDs must be placed in lockers, backpacks, or another location away from students and their desks. Please see the UCS Student Handbook for ECD protocols during state testing. If a student needs to place an emergency phone call during the day, they should request to go to the main office to use an office phone. If a parent needs to give a message to or speak with their child during the school day, they should call the main office. If a student does not comply with the request to provide the staff member their cell phone for a violation, they could face consequences for insubordination/disrespect. The use of an ECD's picture-taking or internet connection capability is not permitted without permission of a teacher or administrator. Utica Community Schools will not be responsible for the theft, loss or damage of any ECD. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken against students who violate the policy regulating ECDs.

If a student is found to be in violation of the above expectations, the following plan will be implemented:

First Violation – Warning #1

Cell phone/ECD will be taken to the office with first and last name of student. Student picks up phone at the end of day.

Second Violation – Warning #2

Cell phone/ECD will be taken to the office with first and last name of student. Malow office will contact the parent. Student picks up phone at the end of day.

Third + Violation

Cell phone/ECD will be taken to the office with first and last name of student. Malow office will contact the parent. Student picks up phone at the end of the day. Disciplinary Action per Administration.

Do You Drive Your Student to School?

Safety in our parking lot is our number one priority. We truly appreciate the patience and courtesy extended between drivers. Please continue to drive slowly and be aware of your surroundings. Our students do a great job complying with our rules in the parking lot, but we still need to be extremely cautious.

If it is necessary to drive your child to school, please use the outer lane for quick drop off of students while reserving the inner lane for thru traffic. Have your student exit the vehicle as **quickly** as possible. **Please do not wait until you are the first car in line before dropping your student off, and do not wait until your child is in the building before driving away.** The idea is to reduce the long line of cars coming into the parking lot in the morning by allowing several cars to drop off students at one time. If you or your student insists on waiting to get to the front of the line to exit the car, the purpose is defeated, and traffic flow will be impeded.

Once buses begin exiting after school, cars must wait until all buses are in the driveway before exiting the parking lot or pick-up area.

Student Procedures for In-Person Instruction

- Students will be allowed to carry string backpacks and full-sized backpacks each day.
- Students will be expected to bring their **charged** laptops each day. It is recommended that the laptops charge overnight to be ready to bring the next day.

- All students will enter the building through Door 1. From there, they will move to 3 separate locations based on grade level:
 - \circ 7th grade will move to cafeteria.
 - $\circ~~8^{th}$ grade will move to the Main Gym.
 - $\circ~~9^{th}$ grade will move to Aux Gym.

Students will remain in these locations until the warning bell rings, at which point they will move immediately to class.

At the end of the day, all students will exit out of Door 1 and Door 2, which are in the front of the building.

Automated Call Phone Contact Update

Utica Community Schools will continue to message important school-related information such as delayed openings or school closure through a number of resources including local media outlets. Food Deliveries at Malow

Food that is delivered by a company such as Door Dash or Grub Hub will not be permitted at Malow. Due to school safety concerns and the disruption to the school day, we cannot accommodate such deliveries. We ask that all students bring their own lunch or buy a lunch from the cafeteria or school store. If a student forgets their lunch, they may borrow against their lunch account in the cafeteria, or a parent may drop off a lunch for their student. However, if the food dropped off is from a restaurant, the student will be asked to eat it in the Main Office during their lunch hour. Coffee, smoothies and outside breakfast brought in the school in the morning must be

consumed before going into first hour. This practice takes place at the high school level and Malow is aligning with Eisenhower in order to provide consistent expectations for our students. Thank you for your understanding and we appreciate your support.

Free Meals for the 2024-2025 School Year

All meals are free this year thanks to the Michigan School Meals law. Students that would like to be eligible for benefits, such as pay-toparticipate sports, college entrance fees, AP testing fees and more still need to fill out the Education Benefits Form or the School Meals Form. These forms are available at <u>https://utica.familyportal.cloud</u>. Please encourage your parents to fill out <u>these forms</u> to ensure we receive our Title I and other specialized funding from the state. Paper applications are available in the main office.

Breakfast meals include up to 2 grains, up to 2 fruits and milk. You must take at least 1/2 cup fruit or vegetable with 2 more items to qualify.

Lunch meals include a grain, meat/meat alternate, vegetable, fruit & milk. Students must take 3 out of 5 with one being 1/2 cup fruit or vegetable to qualify.

Struggling Students

It is important to Malow counselors that ALL our students are successful. For students who may be struggling, we first encourage communication between the parent and the classroom teacher. If missing assignments are a problem, we encourage parents to try changing the question from, "Do you have homework tonight?" to "When will you complete your nightly study time?" Even on rare nights when no homework is assigned, all students will benefit from spending a minimum of 20-30 minutes each night reading textbooks, reviewing vocabulary flashcards, preparing for upcoming quizzes/tests, etc. If students don't bring home books and materials for this study time, parents can assign reading from a book at home, etc. Once students realize that their parents are serious about consistently enforcing a mandatory nightly study time on each school night (Sunday through Thursday), they will begin to bring home and complete their assignments.


