#### **AP Exams**

For the 2024-25 school year, parents and students will submit payments for all AP exams to APTS: <u>Utica Community Schools AP® Exam Payment Submission (aptsusa.com)</u>.

Students will need to complete the process to join an AP class section or AP exam only section to register for an exam

Parents and students will receive an invoice via the email address listed in PowerSchool, from <a href="mailto:info@aptsusa.com">info@aptsusa.com</a> or <a href="mailto:Payments@aptsusa.com">Payments@aptsusa.com</a>. Emails will be sent beginning October 1, 2024. Parents and students may receive up to 5 emails regarding payment.

The cost per assessment is \$105.00. Currently, all students are required to pay a \$40.00 deposit for each exam. The remaining balance will be invoiced in January 2025. This information is posted on the UCS College Central page.


- All students will be able to join an AP® Classroom on the College Board MyAP at http://myap.collegeboard.org where they will be able to access College Board provided course resources and materials as well as an individualized performance dashboard.
- Teachers will be able to use the resources in the MyAP AP® Classroom for assignments, classroom activities, test and guizzes and more.
- Students will log into the MyAP site at http://myap.collegeboard.org with their College Board profiles and JOIN the AP® Class with a Join Code (access code) that will be distributed by teachers by September 18, 2024. (Simply click on "Join Exam/Class" and enter the code.)

#### How to register for 2024-2025 AP® Exams:

AP Exam Fees for 2024-2025 is \$105 per exam (\$155 per AP Capstone exam)

To register for the optional AP® Exams, the additional steps need to be completed:

- STEP 1: Activate Exam on MyAP -Students who have joined the AP Classroom on MyAP and choose to take the optional exam, must also activate the exam by clicking on the yellow "Register for Exam" button in the class dashboard.
  - Deadline to activate your exam is September 18, 2024



- STEP 2: Submit Exam Deposit AP Exams are \$105 each (\$155 for AP Capstone Exams).
   Students who have an active exam on the MyAP System as of September 18 will receive on or around October 1 an invoice for a \$40 non-refundable deposit to be submitted to complete the exam order. Submit payment online or via mailing in a check or money order.
  - Deposit must be submitted by October 31, 2024 to order an exam for May 2025.
  - BOTH the exam deposit payment AND exam activation steps MUST be completed by October 31, 2024 to have an active exam order.
  - LATE registration will open on November 16 with a penalty fee. NO payments or orders will be accepted or processed between November 1 and November 16, 2024
- STEP 3: Submit Balance Due Students who successfully completed step 1 and 2 above by
  will receive a custom digital invoice for the balance of fees due. The invoice will be emailed in
  January. Deadline to submit the balance of fees due is February 14, 2025

#### Utica CSD 2024-2025 AP® Exam Registration

#### Frequently Asked Questions:

#### What if I can't log into my College Board account?

- Don't create a new one! Each student should have only ONE College Board account which houses AP, PSAT and SAT scores and information. For log in help visit:
- https://pages.collegeboard.org/account-help or https://myap.collegeboard.org

#### What if I qualify for a fee reduction?

 All students regardless of status submit a \$40 deposit by October 31. Students who have successfully been approved for Free-Reduced Lunch status AND who sit for the exam in May will be eligible for a partial refund per the MA State subsidies (Amount to be announced).

#### How do I submit the fees?

 Exams are \$105 each (\$155 per AP Capstone Exam). You will receive a custom invoice for a \$40 per exam deposit based on the exams you activated on MyAP. Payment can be submitted by clicking the Pay Now button in the top left of the invoice OR by mailing in a check or money order. (Instructions on the invoice.) A second invoice will be issued in January for the balance due. A 3.1% credit card processing fee is charged for debit/credit card payments.

#### I want to add an exam that is NOT on my invoice. What do I do?

- Email info@aptsusa.com to request an updated invoice.
- You will need to confirm that you have also joined the College Board MyAP dashboard with the appropriate Join Code for your exam. Penalty fees apply for registering an exam as of November 16, 2024. FINAL Day to add an exam or make payments is February 14, 2025.

#### I want to cancel an exam that is on my invoice?





# expectations for 2024-2025



Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, students will NO LONGER be able to carry their large backpacks during the school day from class to class.

Backpacks have become a safety issue in both our hallways and classrooms.

Backpacks MUST remain in student lockers during the school day.



Students may carry a nylon drawstring tote. These hold a maximum of two books and/or the student's assigned laptop, and can hang on the back of student chairs.

Nylon drawstring totes will be available for purchase in The Chieftain Corner Store, or can be purchased at local retailers.



# EVERY student must WEAR his or <u>her</u> student ID while on school grounds.

- · Student IDs must be worn and visible at all times.
- Student ID must be presented to any school staff member or person of authority upon request.
- The front and back of the ID cannot be altered. Defacing or altering the student ID is prohibited.
- · Wearing another student's ID card is prohibited.
- · Lost, stolen, altered, damaged, and/or defaced ID cards must be replaced immediately.

# Students who fail to adhere to the above are subject to an <u>after school</u> detention and replacement fee.

\$5 ID REPLACEMENT for lost/broken IDs

3 times without ID = detention 6 times without ID = automatic \$5 ID replacement & Saturday School

If you are caught not wearing your badge in school 6 or more times, another badge will automatically be printed, and a \$5 fee will be placed on your student account to be paid. (EVEN IF YOU ALREADY HAVE A BADGE)

\*\*Students who are insubordinate or persistently disobedient are subject to further school consequences.

#### **Lunch Deliveries : REMINDER**



Food Deliveries: Food that is delivered by a service such as Door Dash or Grub Hub will not be permitted at Eppler. due to school safety concerns and the disruption to the school day, we cannot accommodate such deliveries. we ask that all students bring their own lunch or buy a lunch from the cafeteria. If a student forgets their lunch, they may borrow against their lunch account in the cafeteria, or a parent may drop off a lunch for their

student. However, if the food dropped off is from a restaurant, the student will be asked to eat it in the Main Office during their lunch hour. Coffee, smoothies, and outside breakfast brought in the school in the morning must be consumed before going into first hour. This is the practice that takes place at the high school level and Eppler is aligning with Utica High in order to provide consistent expectations for our students. #### **Dress Code Rules - REMINDER**

#### Dress code:

Please address the following dress code items with your child:

- Hoods/hats are not to be worn in the building.
- Clothing must not show bare mid-drifts, shoulders, cut too low or any derogatory or drug/alcohol messages.

#### Student Drop-off after 7:20

Parents, please be aware that there is often no need to come into the building when you are dropping off your child at school if they are late or after an appointment. The only reasons we will require you to come into the building are if you are picking up your child, for which you will need ID, or if you are dropping off anything for your child, which we ask that you label for their pick-up. Other than that, please feel free to stay in your warm and dry vehicle (on cold and rainy days) and enjoy whatever you may be listening to from your playlist! Thank you!!

#### **School Safety**

Safety remains a priority for our school. Eppler Junior High School is once again providing training to our students and staff on our safety protocols. #### **Early Dismissal Procedures**

We have a new process for early dismissals. When you arrive at Eppler please ring the bell at our Main Office door, let us know your student's name, show your id to the camera and we will let you in to our vestibule. With your cell phone please scan the QR code on the red "Scan For Early Dismissal" poster on the wall, type in the information requested, and we will call your student down to leave with you.

STUDENTS: You must come through the front office to exit the school.

#### **How to Report an Absence**

- When a student is going to be absent, parents/guardians should report the absence before the school day begins. Calls to the attendance line can be made 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The Shelby Attendance Line is **586-797-2799**. Absences will be input to PowerSchool by 4:00 pm on the date of the absence.
- Per UCS policy, the following reasons for an absence will be accepted as an excused absence; student illness, hospitalization, doctor ordered bed rest, mandatory court appearance, death in the immediate family, family vacation, medical appointments and administrative permission. **All other absences will be unexcused.**

#### Utica Athletic Event Admissions Policy

- All students (home and visitor) must present a school ID for entrance to the game.



# Attendance Area Updates

With the reconstruction of elementary schools, Utica Community Schools is able to address long-standing concerns related to school attendance areas.

Through reconstruction of buildings and consolidation of school attendance areas, we are able to give more students access to updated facilities designed to support learning with innovative instructional spaces.

The goal is to better serve families so elementary students attend schools within their larger neighborhoods and can advance together with their peers to secondary schools.

Currently, the district's citizens Enrollment Distribution Advisory Committee (a standing citizens group with representatives of each school that annually reviews attendance areas) is reviewing patterns for elementary schools feeding into Henry Ford II High School.

This includes Browning, Dresden, Ebeling, Graebner, Harvey and Havel Elementary Schools. The review also includes portions of attendance areas for DeKeyser and Oakbrook elementary schools that are located north of Clinton River and East of Van Dyke.



#### Overview

- Through the implementation of 2023 Bond Issue, UCS is addressing complexities in attendance areas that were largely developed 50 years ago.
- Current attendance areas feature some neighborhood subdivisions geographically disconnected from neighboring communities and boundaries that do not take advantage of major landmarks and roadways.
- The facility review process includes the reconstruction/replacement of elementary schools and consolidation of elementary buildings.
- By updating select elementary schools and consolidating school attendance areas,
   UCS will create greater access for students to updated facilities that support growth and achievement.
- Schools are being evaluated based on three criteria: overall safety, age of the facility and enrollment patterns and trends for the school.
- Attendance areas currently under review include those feeding into Henry Ford II High School and areas of DeKeyser and Oakbrook elementary schools located north of Clinton River.
- Input is being received from the Enrollment Distribution Advisory Committee (EDAC), which is comprised of parent/guardian representatives from each school.

#### **Allergens Form**

We take food allergies and student safety very seriously. If your student has any food allergies, please have your physician fill out the MDE Dietary Needs Form and return it to the food service office. MDE Special Diet Form.

- 1- You must fill out a physician signed MDE Special Needs Accommodation form and send it to the Food Service office. Without this, we cannot make any accommodations. Please make sure to be specific with regards to the allergy (Example: all dairy or just fluid milk intolerance, etc.)
- 2-Because allergies can change, you MUST fill out a new form EVERY YEAR.
- 3- You must indicate to your child's school which days and which menu item you would like at least 48 hours in advance. We will not automatically have these available if we do not hear from parents in advance.
- 4-A vegetarian and nut free options are available every day, so please see the regular menu.
- 5-Juice or water are not acceptable substitutes per USDA guidelines. At this time, we have Kikkoman Soy milk as a substitute. You're welcome to send in your own milk with your child if they don't like it.
- 6-We will do the best we can to accommodate other requests but there may be some limitations. For questions, please call our food service office at 586-797-1180


