Use this planning guide to figure out what career you will research. This guide will help you brainstorm and narrow down your thinking so that you can pick one career and make sure you research something you're the most interested in. Follow the steps below! Keep in mind that even if you're not sure about what you want to do, you still have to complete this brainstorming sheet!

Step One: Career Industries or Fields

An industry is defined as "the people and activities involved in producing a particular thing, or in providing a particular service." Examples include the automobile industry, which includes every job involved in creating a car; the education industry (teachers, principals, textbook writers, etc.); and the medical industry (doctors, nurses, radiologists, etc.). Refer to the titles of the career trees to choose 3 industries.

Step Two: Narrow it Down

Every industry includes many different jobs. For example, the medical industry or field includes doctors, nurses, researchers, medical technology sales, hospital administrators, radiologists, phlebotomists, and many others. Below, write the name of your top choice field on the left, and then write why that is your top choice on the right side.

Step Three: Keep Narrowing

Now that you've chosen your top industry and you know why you want to go into this field, choose 3 jobs within that field that you are interested in pursuing. Put the in order, with 1 being the job you most want and 3 being the job that you would be ok with.
