Once your family is enrolled, SUN Bucks will be automatically added to your SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) account or you will be issued a separate EBT (Electronic Benefit Transfer) card.

Families will be automatically enrolled in SUN Bucks if they are already enrolled in SNAP, TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families.)

**The Education Benefit Form (EBF) will not count towards this - you will need to enroll separately for SUN Bucks.**

**Apply by April 15, 2025 to be eligible for the first issuance of benefits in May 2025. Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis until August 31, 2025.**



# HFII CHEER TRYOUT REQUIREMENTS

All athletes who tryout will make a team either JV or varsity. NO CUTS!!!

having the skills outlined below **does not** guarantee you a spot on varsity, it is just the minimum requirements! **All athletes should have good attitudes, be a team player, and have willingness to learn!**

## Varsity hard requirements

- right leg back walkover or higher (bhs, tuck, etc)
- table top level jumps
- tight and properly placed motions
- energetic facials and powerful vocals
- stunting: extended cupie (lib preferred)
- flyers must be able to perform a twist cradle
- switch splits to the ground (preferred)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT  
SIDELINE CHEER AT HF II

1. **When are tryouts** Tryouts are June 2nd, 3rd, and 4th
2. **Will I need a sports physical for tryouts?** Yes. **You will need a sports physical dated APRIL 15, 2025 or after** to try out for sideline cheer. All physicals need to be uploaded to Big Teams
3. **Will there be a parent meeting prior to tryouts?** Yes! Our parent meeting is scheduled for May 12th in the media center at Ford (6:00 pm). All athletes and at least one parent/guardian are required to attend the meeting.
4. **What skills will be evaluated at tryouts?** We will evaluate an athlete's tumbling skills, jumps, flexibility, motions, vocals, facials and stunting capabilities at tryouts.
5. **When do practices begin?** Practice for both teams begins on June 5th
6. **Do we practice throughout the entire summer?** Yes, we will practice throughout the summer. With the exception of June 30th-July 4th and August 4th-8th when there are no practices
7. **Are practices mandatory in the summer?** We cannot make practices mandatory in June and July. However, it is **VERY** important to attend practices so that you don't fall behind your teammates. Athletes learn an abundance of cheers, stunts, and tumbling during the summer months. Rules and expectations regarding our absence policy will be outlined in our rules packet and discussed at our parent/athlete meeting prior to tryouts. If you are in town, we do expect you to attend practices. **ALL PRACTICES BECOME MANDATORY STARTING THE WEEK OF AUGUST 11TH.**
8. **How many days a week are practices?** Practices are typically 3 days/week during the summer and 3 days/week (plus game day) during the school year.
9. **Do we attend camp?** Yes! Varsity will be attending camp July 21-23 with Total Effect Cheer at Grand Valley State University and JV will be attending camp August 2-4 with North American Spirit at Echo Grove
10. **Is there a Pay to Participate fee?** No. Sideline cheer is a club sport at HFII. Therefore, there is no pay to participate fee owed to UCS. However, there are other costs associated with sideline cheer. Such as - tumbling fees, practice clothes, warm-ups, bows, poms, backpack, camp, etc. All fees will be outlined in our financial packet and discussed at our parent/athlete meeting prior to tryouts.
11. **How do we get information from coaches?** We use the app, **Stack Team App** to communicate with athletes/parents/guardians. You can also visit their website, [www.teamapp.com](http://www.teamapp.com) to create an account.
12. **What can I do to prepare for tryouts?** Start stretching daily! Don't just concentrate on your splits. Start stretching your back and shoulders too. Shoulder and back flexibility are both important for tumbling. Work those jumps every day. Concentrate on height, pointed toes, and sticking your landing. Practice your motions and facials in a mirror. Strong, solid motions are a must for our program. Work on your tumbling. Take advantage of open gyms at places like A3 Sports and with Recon Skills Technique
13. **What are the requirements to make varsity?** Minimum requirements to make varsity include - right leg back walkover or higher (back handspring, back tuck, etc); tabletop jumps (parallel to the ground); tight and properly placed motions; energetic facials; powerful vocals; ability to stunt an extended cupie; ability to stunt an extended twist cradle; switch splits to the ground (**\*PLEASE NOTE** - The ability to perform a back walkover (or higher tumbling skills) does not guarantee a placement on varsity. We look at all aspects of cheer when making team placements)





Other top tips include drug/alcohol use, weapon possession, or assault.

Upon receipt of a tip, specially trained OK2SAY technicians address the immediate need and forward the information to the appropriate responding law enforcement agency or organization. Tips go to schools, local law enforcement agencies, community mental health agencies or the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services.

To ensure tips are acted upon, agencies receiving tips are asked to submit outcome reports detailing how the tip was handled. Annual reports on the program's impact detail the types and numbers of tips handled. Annual reports are available on the OK2SAY website.


Dear Parent or Guardian,

To enhance communication regarding student attendance, we will be utilizing Attendance Intervention, a PowerSchool product designed to streamline updates and alerts for families. With Attendance Intervention, you will receive text messages and email alerts directly from teachers and school leaders, keeping you informed about your child's attendance in real time.

What makes Attendance Intervention unique?

- **No Login Required:** Messages will automatically be sent to the phone number and email address the school has on file for you.
- **Direct Communication:** Each message will come from a unique phone number associated with the sender. This direct line allows you to easily save the sender's number in your phone and reply directly to them, if desired.
- **Absence Alerts:** Families will be notified if a student is absent from school in a timely fashion.
- **Say Goodbye to Language Barriers:** Attendance Intervention translates text and email messages into more than 90 languages, based on the preferred language on file.



## **Bemis Attendance Line**

Parents are reminded to call the school attendance line, **586-797-2599**, to report their child's absence or tardiness. In order to be excused, all late/tardy students must be called in by a parent. A doctor's note must be provided to excuse late/tardy arrivals. Bemis Attendance line is available 24 hours a day. All late arrival/tardy students must report to the Main Office upon arrival to receive a late pass. If your child is absent and we have not received notification, we will call the parents.

## **Early Dismissal**

Students who need to be excused during the school day should bring a signed note from their parents to the Main Office before school begins that morning. The note should include the date, time, and reason for dismissal as well as who will be picking the child up. By doing this, we keep classroom disruptions to a minimum as well as have your child waiting for you in the Main Office when you arrive. **PLEASE NOTE: Anyone signing a student out, must show identification and that person must also be on the students' contact list.** Students will not be released to anyone that is not listed on the contact list.

## **Homework Requests**

Homework requests are not accepted until the third consecutive day of absence. You may request your child's homework on that third day by emailing your child's teacher. You can find a list of email addresses by clicking [here](#).

## **Use of Electronic Communication Devices is Prohibited**

The personal use of cell phones or other electronic communications devices (ECD) by students is prohibited at any time while in school or in a district vehicle. Students may carry ECDs during the school day, but they cannot be displayed or used without permission from a teacher or administrator for educational purposes. Personal use of the device shall be limited to the time before and after the school day and only when students are outside the building. ECDs shall not be used during instructional time, lunch, passing time between classes or on any school bus without permission of a school official. The use of an ECD's picture-taking or internet connection capability is not permitted without permission of a teacher or administrator. Utica Community Schools will not be responsible for the theft, loss or damage of any ECD. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken against students who violate the policy regulating ECDs.

**If a student's ECD rings/vibrates during the school day, the ECD will be confiscated and must be picked up in the main office by the student's parent.** Should this occur a second time, the student will receive a one-day suspension. If a student uses an ECD anytime inside the school, the ECD will be confiscated and the student will receive a one-day suspension.

### **Concussion Awareness**

As part of a new state law, all UCS and Michigan parents will receive information about concussions, their symptoms and what to do if you suspect a concussion.
