
**United States JCI Senate Foundation
College/University
Scholarship Application**

Eligibility:

- **Graduating high school seniors in the United States, who reside in a state that has an active JCI Senate program and a scholarship chairperson.**
Check www.usjcisenate.org under the scholarship tab for a listing of participating states. **If your state is not listed, you are not eligible to apply.**
- **STUDENTS MUST HAVE A GPA OF 3.75 AND ABOVE TO BE CONSIDERED.**
- **You must be a U.S. citizen to apply for this scholarship.**

This package contains information and directions to apply for the United States JCI Senate Foundation Scholarship Program. Scholarship grants in amounts of \$1,500 or \$2000 will be awarded to graduating high school seniors in the United States, who plan to continue their education at an accredited post-secondary college or university within the United States. Fifty (50) grants will be awarded to 2026 graduates by the United States JCI Senate Foundation. Scholarships must be used for tuition in the first year of full-time study immediately following high school graduation. Checks will be made out in the name of the recipient and will be paid directly to the chosen college/university.

Instructions for the US JCI Senate Foundation Scholarship Application

A. The submission preference will be in a **MICROSOFT WORD COMPATABLE FORMAT.**

The application must be typed in black ink. Print using single-sided sheets of paper.

B. ON EACH PAGE OF THE APPLICATION PACKAGE, NEATLY HAND PRINT YOUR NAME AND THE PAGE NUMBER (in ink) AT THE TOP RIGHT CORNER.

Begin with the checklist as page 1, the photo page is 2, then continue to number the application and all attachments in the correct order. If reference letters or transcripts are submitted in sealed envelopes, number the envelopes for proper placement and the chairman will insert them.

Staple all pages together in the upper left corner.

C. Each student must have an active, working e-mail address listed.

D. All materials **MUST** be submitted in one mailing.

Materials sent in multiple mailings **WILL NOT** be accepted.

E. Your application will be evaluated by individuals outside of your area.

Do not use acronyms for clubs, events, awards, etc. If the name is not self explanatory, include a description. Examples: REACH should include a description such as: Oak City REACH Program to feed the homeless, or J. Smith Award for Top Female Tennis Player.

F. NO ELECTRONIC SUBMISSIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

G. Included in this application package are all the necessary forms and instructions regarding additional information required.

YOUR APPLICATION PAGES MUST BE SUBMITTED IN THE ORDER LISTED BELOW, FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL BE CAUSE FOR DISQUALIFICATION.

You must include a 2 x 3-inch head shot photo for use in our national publications. This photo should be neatly taped to a sheet of white paper with your name and state listed under the photo.

Your high school grade transcripts should be the last attachment to your application package.

Any student with a GPA of 3.75 and above will be considered for this scholarship grant.

ACT/SAT national test scores should be included if you have taken these tests. NOTE: The ACT/SAT scores are not mandatory, but judging points will be awarded for the test scores, if included.

H. Do not include these first two pages of instructions with your application submission.

I. To submit your application package:

Refer to the website www.usjcisenate.org under the scholarship section. Using the "State Chairman Contact List" locate the state where you live and submit your application to the state chairperson or contact listed for that state. If your state is not listed, you are not eligible to apply. Do not submit the application to any address on the web page except the person listed under *your* State Scholarship Contact section (packages submitted to the wrong address will not be forwarded).
