ATTENDANCE – (586)797-1999

A parent must call the attendance line at (586)797-1999 the day of the absence or prior if your student will be absent, tardy or will have an early dismissal. The attendance desk will enter the attendance in Powerschool. DO NOT call the main office for attendance.

- For early dismissals, please call the attendance line early in the day so the Attendance Secretary can enter the early dismissal in PowerSchool. The student should inform their teacher, upon arriving to class, that they have an early dismissal.

Michigan Rehabilitation Services (MRS) is a State of Michigan agency whose purpose is to assist individuals with disabilities that may be on an IEP to prepare for, obtain, and maintain employment. MRS is state and federally funded, so there is often no cost to the individual for the agency's services.

Some of the things MRS may be able to provide include:

- Vocational counseling & guidance – help students discover their interests & talents and explore possible career pathways
- Accommodation assessments and accommodations if needed
- OJE – On-the-Job Evaluation – paid wages
- Job Training – as appropriate for job goal
- Michigan Career and Technical Institute (MCTI) – live on campus and train 'hands-on' in areas such as: Auto mechanic; Cabinetmaking; Cert Nurse Asst; Pharmacy Tech; Welding; Culinary; and more (free to MRS customers)
- Resume building and mock interviews
- Soft skills training/classes (social/interpersonal skills)

Attendance Area Update

Utica Community Schools is continuing to address long-standing issues with school attendance areas. The review is in conjunction with facility improvements across the district.

When reviewing attendance area configurations, safety, the age of the facility and enrollment trends are being considered.

Currently, the district's Enrollment Distribution Advisory Committee (a standing citizens group with representatives from each school that reviews attendance areas) is assessing patterns for schools that feed into Stevenson High School and continuing its review of Henry Ford II High School feeder schools. Also, portions of the Monfort and Flickinger attendance areas are under review based on how they are embedded or in close proximity to the attendance boundaries of Dresden, Harvey and Ebeling elementary schools.

The attendance areas under review are on the second page of this fact sheet. Changes to these attendance areas would be effective for fall of 2028-2029 in conjunction with facility improvements.

Overview

- Through the implementation of facility improvements, UCS is addressing complexities in attendance areas that were largely developed 50 years ago.
- Current attendance areas feature some neighborhood subdivisions geographically disconnected from neighboring communities and boundaries that do not take advantage of major landmarks and roadways.
- The facility review process includes a long-range facility improvement plan and consolidation of buildings.
- By improving select elementary schools and consolidating school attendance areas, UCS would create greater access for students to updated facilities that support growth and achievement.
- Schools are being evaluated based on three criteria: overall safety, age of the facility and enrollment trends for the school.
- Attendance areas currently under review include feeder schools to Stevenson High School and Henry Ford II High School. Consolidation may also impact students assigned to nearby areas that feed into Utica High, such as Monfort and Flickinger Elementary.
- Input is being received from the Enrollment Distribution Advisory Committee (EDAC), comprised of community representatives from each school.

Dear UCS Community,

I recently shared an update on continued work to address long-standing issues with our attendance areas. The update provided information on how we are evaluating the feeder patterns for Stevenson High School and Henry Ford II High School. This work is being coordinated in conjunction with scheduled facility improvements throughout our district.

We have developed an attendance area plan in partnership with our Enrollment Distribution Advisory Committee (EDAC), which is comprised of community members from each school.

Over the past few months, this committee has provided input into a plan that focuses on neighborhood schools that would strengthen communities and create greater access for students to improved facilities. The recommendations also establish consistent secondary feeder patterns where students remain with their friends throughout their K-12 journey. The plan includes changes to each of the following schools reviewed by our Enrollment Distribution Advisory Committee. These adjustments are planned for the fall of 2028:

- **Harvey Elementary School** - Dresden Elementary students will be consolidated with the existing Harvey Elementary attendance areas east of Van Dyke. The district's Auxiliary Services Department is evaluating Harvey Elementary to determine the facility improvements that will support the change. A portion of the school's attendance area in Shelby Township will be merged with an adjacent Flickinger Elementary neighborhood. This neighborhood will follow the Flickinger Elementary feeder pattern of Eppler Junior High School to Utica High School. (See [Map](#))
- **Schwarzkoft Elementary School** - The Plumbrook Elementary attendance area east of Van Dyke will be consolidated with Schwarzkoft Elementary and DeKeyser Elementary. The district's Auxiliary Services Department is evaluating Schwarzkoft Elementary to determine the facility improvements that will support the change. Also, through a partnership with the Macomb Intermediate School District (MISD), improvements will be made to the facility to meet the unique needs of the Physically or Otherwise Health Impaired (POHI) program. In addition, a remote section of Schwarzkoft Elementary attendance area west of Van Dyke will be consolidated with adjoining Schuchard Elementary neighborhoods. (See [Map](#))

• **Dresden Elementary School** - Dresden Elementary will be consolidated into neighboring school communities. The southern portion of Dresden Elementary will be merged with an improved Harvey Elementary facility. In Shelby Township, remote portions of the attendance areas will be merged with adjacent Ebeling Elementary and Monfort Elementary attendance areas. (See [Map](#))

• **Plumbrook Elementary School** - Plumbrook Elementary will be consolidated into neighboring school communities. The attendance area east of Van Dyke and west of Dodge Park will be merged with Schwarzkoft Elementary, including the relocation of the countywide Physically or Otherwise Health Impaired (POHI) program. Working in partnership with the Macomb Intermediate School District, a space will be created to specifically meet the unique needs of POHI students. The portion east of Dodge Park will be merged with an adjoining DeKeyser Elementary neighborhood. The remote portion of the school boundaries west of Van Dyke will be merged with the adjacent Burr Elementary attendance areas. (See [Map](#))

• **Burr Elementary School** - A remote portion of the Burr Elementary boundaries between the Conrail Rail System and Van Dyke will be merged with an adjacent Harvey Elementary attendance area. This neighborhood will also become part of the Bemis Junior High School and Henry Ford II High School feeder pattern. (See [Map](#))

• **DeKeyser Elementary School** - A remote section of the DeKeyser Elementary attendance area west of Van Dyke will be merged with Burr Elementary. The attendance area is in close proximity to the Burr Elementary property. (See [Map](#))

• **Oakbrook Elementary School** - A small attendance area off Plumbrook Road, east of Dodge Park, will be consolidated with the adjacent DeKeyser Elementary attendance area. (See [Map](#))

• **Monfort Elementary School** - A portion of the school's attendance area that was embedded into Dresden Elementary's boundaries will merge with neighboring Ebeling Elementary. This neighborhood is northeast of Schoenherr and 22 Mile Road. This neighborhood will also become part of the Bemis Junior High School and Henry Ford II High School feeder pattern. (See [Map](#))

• **Schuchard Elementary School** - Portions of the Schwarzkoft Elementary attendance area west of Van Dyke will be merged with adjoining Schuchard Elementary. (See [Map](#))

The following change will be scheduled for fall of 2027:

- **West Utica Elementary School** - All West Utica Elementary students will feed into Eppler Junior High School. Previously, West Utica Elementary students attended Jeannette Junior High School, which largely feeds into Stevenson High School. This

change will establish a pattern of West Utica Elementary School, Eppler Junior High School, and Utica High School, which is consistent with schools in this area. (See [Map](#))





Map reflects previous changes for the Fall of 2027





Stevenson High School Communication Process Flowchart

How to Effectively Communicate with Stevenson High School Officials

Parents are often discouraged when they attempt to communicate with school officials only to be referred to others in order to resolve a problem their child may be experiencing in school. To prevent that frustration, parents should become informed about the "Communication Process Flowchart." This sequence is in place to assist parents on where to begin their communication regarding their problem or concern.

Most parent and community questions are easily and completely answered by communicating directly with the staff member closest to the situation. As you move further along the flowchart, the staff is less directly involved and usually needs additional time to research the situation before they can give you an answer. If you do not hear back from the person you have contacted within two (2) business days, it is appropriate to reach out to them again before moving along to the next level of the flowchart. We do not expect your questions or concerns to go unanswered for a long period of time. Each situation should first be addressed at whatever level the initial action was taken with appeals moving on to the next level on the "Communication Process Flowchart." The easiest way to communicate is via e-mail while a phone call is the next preferable way.



School Safety and Security

School ID Badges Ensuring safety and security for all students and staff is a priority each day. In addition to enhancing security, the wearing of ID badges provides a professional setting and promotes College and Career Readiness for all students.

Wearing of IDs is required as part of many workplace environments, as well as on many college and university campuses. One student ID and lanyard will be provided to every student at no cost.

The benefits and reasons for students wearing a current student ID card are:

- To be in class
- To purchase lunch
- To borrow library books and textbooks
- To obtain early dismissal
- To allow movement during school, going to and from restrooms, etc.
- To be on campus before or after school
- To participate in school activities, assemblies, dances, etc. at school.

Student ID Guidelines

A student's ID card authorizes him/her to be on the school campus. **EVERY** student must wear his or her student ID card while on school grounds. It is crucial that the school staff can identify everyone on campus. The identification of staff and students is a safety issue and will not be compromised. Student IDs may be left in the student's assigned locker overnight to ensure the student ID is not left at home. The following guidelines must be adhered to when wearing student ID cards:

1. Student ID cards must always be worn and visible (i.e., not kept in a purse, pocket, or backpack).
2. The student ID card must be presented to any school staff member or person of authority upon request.
3. The front and back of the student ID card cannot be altered (i.e., no markings, other photos, etc.). Defacing or altering the student ID is prohibited.
4. Wearing another student's ID card is prohibited.
5. Lost, stolen, altered, damaged and/or defaced student ID cards must be replaced immediately.

Students who fail to adhere to the above guidelines are subject to a lunch detention (or after school detention) and a replacement fee of \$5.00 to replace a lost ID badge. Students can purchase a new lanyard from the school or purchase one on their own. Tear away lanyards are recommended. Students who are insubordinate or persistently disobedient are subject to further school consequences.

Attendance Policy

Another important reminder is to take time with your student to review the UCS High School Credit Review Rules and Procedures. In short, it starts by saying that a student has a responsibility to attend, be on time and prepared for each scheduled class. When a student nears or is at 10 absences (any combination of absences or tardies) they will meet with their Associate Principal and parents will be notified. When a student has accumulated 11 absences* in any one class over the course of a semester, the student will be notified in a meeting with an assistant/associate principal that they have lost credit in that class and that they are placed on an attendance contract to earn the credit back. There are two parts to a contract. First, the student must pass the class with a D- or higher. Second, the student will show improvement in attendance in ALL classes. Improvement is determined on a sliding scale which allows for 1 absence for every three weeks (rounded up) left in the semester for each class.

Please take the time to read and discuss this with your students, and make sure they understand.

Attendance and Early Dismissal Procedures

Please call **586-797-1999** and follow the prompts:

1 = Early Dismissals 2 = Late Arrival 3 = All Day Absences

Please do not call the main office for attendance. When an Early Dismissal is necessary, a PARENT MUST call in the dismissal before the student leaves. Otherwise, your student will be marked unexcused. Also, your student must check in with the Main Office before they leave campus to ensure their safety. PowerSchool is now generating automated phone calls to parents informing them of any absences for their students daily. Please use your Parent Portal to view your student's attendance.

If you have any concerns, email the individual teacher directly through the staff tab of the school's website or through the PowerSchool. If a correction is warranted, the teacher will request one. Our goal is to have call-ins recorded before the office closes for the day. However, if you have any questions regarding your student's attendance, please wait 24 hours to ensure that all records are complete and up to date.

ATTENDANCE PROGRAM

Parking permits are dependent on attendance. Students who have accumulated 5 or more tardies and/or Unexcused absences, will not receive their parking permit for the 1st five weeks of the school year. At that point, with responsible attendance, parking will be reevaluated for the school year. In addition, outstanding fees must be paid in full to be eligible for a parking permit. Reminder that students are expected to be in school on time. Parking Permits may be suspended for the following reasons:

- ❖ Excessive unexcused absences or tardies

Fines and Fees



Please check your student's PowerSchool account 'Dashboard' for Outstanding fees. Outstanding fees should be paid immediately. Fee details can be viewed by clicking on **Site Map** in the upper right corner, then **Balance**, then **Transaction**.

- The most common fees are Replacement Student Ids* \$5.00 each, Replacement Lanyard* \$3.00, Senior Class Dues \$30.00, Junior Class Dues \$15.00, or Sophomore Class Dues \$15.00. *All students are required to have their School Id with them and visible while on school property. We provide each student their first Student Id and Stevenson lanyard free of charge. Students without their School Id are required to purchase a replacement ID, replacement Lanyards are also available.

Be FAFSA Form Ready: Create your StudentAid.gov account now

You and a parent need StudentAid.gov accounts to be FAFSA® form ready

The new 2025–26 *Free Application for Federal Student Aid* (FAFSA®) form is coming by Dec. 1, 2024. Submitting the FAFSA form is the first step to getting federal student grants, scholarships, work-study opportunities, and student loans. [Who is eligible for federal student aid?](#)

Make your form submission as easy as possible by doing two things. First, create your StudentAid.gov account now. Second, if you're under 24 years old, have your parent to create their account before December 1 as well.

1. [Create your StudentAid.gov account](#) or make sure you can access your existing account by [signing in to StudentAid.gov](#).
2. If you're under 24, get a parent to create their account. [Check this chart](#) to confirm whether a parent or spouse also needs to have an account before you can submit your FAFSA form.

Having trouble? [Get answers to common questions](#) about creating a StudentAid.gov account.

What do I need to create a StudentAid.gov account?

- Name (exactly as it appears on your Social Security card if you have one)
- Date of birth
- Personal email address
- Social Security number (if you have one)

Remember: You'll have only one StudentAid.gov account to use for the rest of your life, so make sure to use an email address that you'll have access to even after you graduate from school or change jobs.

How do I know if a parent or spouse also need to create an account?

- [Check this chart](#) to see whether any other contributors, like a parent or spouse, also need to create an account before you can submit your FAFSA form.
- If you're still not sure whether you need a parent to sign your form, [confirm if you're an independent or dependent](#) student.

- If you're a dependent student, you (or your parent) can use the [Who's My FAFSA Parent](#) wizard to figure out which parent, guardian or spouse also needs to create an account.

What if I don't have a Social Security number (SSN) or my parent doesn't have an SSN?

- If you have an SSN, you must provide it when creating an account.
- All students must have an SSN to create a StudentAid.gov account unless you are from the Freely Associated States (Micronesia, Marshall Islands, or Palau). [Check eligibility here](#).
- If you are a parent or spouse who does not have an SSN, you can still create a StudentAid.gov account to contribute to a student's FAFSA form. When creating your account, leave the SSN field blank and select "What if I don't have a Social Security number?"
- If only one parent has an SSN, that parent is the one who should create an account and join the student's FAFSA form as a contributor.

Note: if you get a message saying the SSN you entered is already in use when you try to create a StudentAid.gov account, make sure you entered the SSN correctly. If you entered the SSN correctly, then it's likely you created an account previously or someone else (such as a parent) created an account for you. Try logging in rather than creating a new account. If you have trouble logging in, try resetting your password or using another email address. You can also check with a parent to see if a StudentAid.gov account already exists for you. If you're sure an account has not already been created, [contact the office of Federal Student Aid](#) for more help. Do not attempt to use an ITIN or other value in place of an SSN for online account creation.

Stevenson Athletics Event Admissions Policy

- 1. All students (home and guests) must present a school ID for entrance to the event.**
- 2. Only high school students from UCS and the competing school shall be admitted without adult supervision.**
- 3. All students must be seated in the upper bleacher area even if they are accompanied by an adult.**
- 4. All junior high / middle school students must present a school ID AND be supervised by an adult. The adult must attend the event with the student and may not leave the student unsupervised.**
- 5. All Stevenson Athletic events are entirely cash free. Presales on GoFan are the best and most efficient means of entry. Be advised that there is a \$1 service fee added to all ticket sales.**
- 6. In order to avoid fees, yearly athletic passes (student, adult, and/or family) can be purchased from the bookstore or athletic office.**
- 7. All senior citizens (62+) and children under 12 (with an adult) are admitted free of charge.**
- 8. All patrons must remain in the stands or concourse area. Only team and athletic department personnel are allowed on the sidelines, field or court. Please don't gather in door or aisle ways.**
- 9. Stevenson has a strict no re-entry policy, and no bags or containers will be allowed.**
